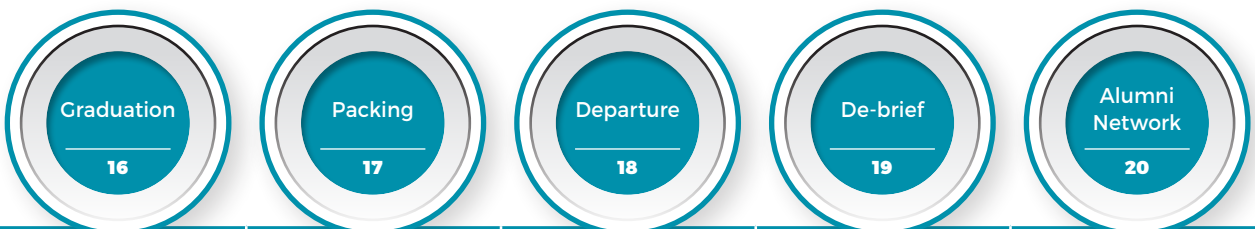

Check if you are eligible to apply. You must be an owner in the Trust or a descendant of a current living owner. You must be able to apply for and hold a J1 visa for the United States.	Closing date for applications is Friday 14 June 2019	Your eligibility status and application is checked. You will be advised if there are any issues with your application.	The Selection Panel reviews applications and prepares a shortlist for interviews. Applicants who are not shortlisted are advised.	Interviews are scheduled and held at the Trust office in Taupō. Transport assistance will be provided.	The Selection Panel makes a recommendation on the preferred candidate(s). Unsuccessful applicants are advised.	If approved, the preferred candidate(s) receives a written scholarship offer. The candidate(s) must accept the offer in writing.	Placement processing begins – application for a J1 visa for the United States, Ministry of Justice Criminal Conviction check, passport check and programme enrolment.	Pre-departure briefing, confirmation of travel, accommodation, insurance and stipend arrangements. UC Berkeley programme confirmed.	Depart for San Francisco. Arrive in time to settle into accommodation and participate in the Orientation Week programme.	Arrive in San Francisco. Met by UC Berkeley Goldman School of Public Policy representatives.	Settle into accommodation provided by the Trust.	Attend week long Orientation course with other students.	Start study programme.	Ongoing contact and support is provided by the Trust and our partners during your scholarship.
